
West Coast Teachers Charity Feis








As a high school student, Anna Cutshall joined our first classes at Step One with her friend Amy. She loved dance and all things Celtic!

"My favorite Irish dance memories were either when we did the day of dance show, or back when the school moved from Fire House Five to Clara. It was amazing to go to a full studio."




2023 Saint Patrick's Day Parade
