McKeever School Hosts Grade Exams



We were very sad not to host our McKeever School Feis in its second year. It would have occurred on October 3rd and 4th at Hiram Johnson High School and we eagerly look forward to hosting it in 2021! Luckily we were still able to host CLRG Grade Exams at the Auditorium in CLARA that same weekend. For many of our dancers this was an important opportunity during a time when progressing in their dance careers competitively has been paused. We hired an SDCRG (or a judge of judges!) Vinny O'Connor to

examine Dancers from all different schools, some traveling as far as Texas. There were a total of 86 exams taken over 2 days and 30 of them McKeevers! With the exam format we were able to space out dancers in small groups and keep people safe with masks and social distancing. Thank you to all the volunteers who helped us check in dancers and run this event so smoothly. We got a lot of compliments on how the event ran professionally and safely. We had dancers as young as 6 taking their first exams (Lucy B and Eliana S) and some of our senior dancers Moriah Payne and Natalie McKeever passed grades 11 and 12 with top marks. These exams are required in order to sit your TCRG exam to become a dance teacher. We hope to host these every year so that tons of McKeever dancers who may dream of teaching one day will have the chance to be certified. Congrats to all the dancers who passed each and every exam, this was not an easy feat!

For Preliminary Champions their is no way to move up to the top level of Open Champion unless you attend a real feis. This is the one competitive level that teachers discretion does not apply. So this has been exceptionally hard for ALL our hardworking Prelim Champs. Two of our dancers, Sophia and Savannah, have shown unwavering dedication to training and learning new material that we wanted to applaud their achievements these past few months. We understand it has not been possible for everyone to travel to competitions and that is ok, even Miss Natalie who only needs one more first to get to Open has not been able to travel and compete since February. With so few competitions being held dancers are driving long hours to places like Wyoming, Utah and Arizona just for a chance to achieve their dreams. This also means the competitions are pretty stiff and both girls have been up against the best dancers in their age groups. On Sept 6th both girls travelled to Arizona Sophia placing 3rd in Under 9 and 4th in Under 10 age group Savannah won a 2nd in Under 15 and 4th in Under 16. Then on September 19th Sophia travelled to Wyoming and got first both days in her hardshoe and second in softshoe in the round awards and she won the blind treble reel challenge!! Then on November 21st and 22nd Sophia and Savannah both won second place in stiff competitions at the Las Vegas Championships! Showing up and looking your best during these times is such a huge deal for our school and we are very thankful for how both of you are representing yourselves and team McKeever.





Outdoor Holiday Market



It also was a chance for us to solidify the decision to move 4 dancers up to the Champion level. This means despite all the craziness of 2020 we still have 5 new Champions! Sarah L, Megan L, Devin P, Ruby K and Eleni K!!! Sarah went from a beginner at the start of the year and blew us away with her rapid growth as a dancer! Megan earned her Champion title despite having to work and attend college digitally! Devin learned so much material on her own from videos at such a young age that we were awestruck. Little Ruby showed us she had the heart of Champion and moved her last dance up with and amazing performance! Lastly Eleni has excelled completely learning and developing her skills online through zoom and video instruction. We haven't even seen Eleni or Megan in person since March!

There were three dancers who earned all 7 awards and will get the Presidential Award from the Irish Dance Teachers Association of North America! Amy Sinead Dodd, Arabelle Jones and Devin Powell will receive a special certificate (artwork by Miss McKeever) that is signed by the IDTANA president Russel Beaton. The Traditional Set Dances are varying levels of difficulty and always danced to a specific melody. They are dances choreographed by dance masters over 100 years ago and very important in the preservation of our Irish Dance heritage.


Getting in the Christmas Spirit and Performing Safely
